




About the Visual Arts Center of Richmond



ot going out of town for spring break? Send the kids to the Visual Arts Center of Richmond for art classes. Spring Break ArtVenture runs from Monday, April 10 through Thursday, April 13. There are no classes on Friday, April 14.

Need a full-day solution? Enroll your child in both a morning and afternoon class, and you can take advantage of our extended day program. Extended day costs \$75 for the week, and allows your child to bring a packed lunch and stay at VisArts from 12 to 1 p.m. They can also remain at the center until 5 p.m. for pick-up.

Morning Classes

Morning classes run from 9 a.m. to noon. Kids can be dropped off at VisArts beginning at 8:30 a.m. and must be picked up promptly at noon unless they're enrolled in our extended day program.

Watercolor Painting with Mary Miller Ages 6-7

Learn several watercolor techniques that will prepare you to paint abstract and landscape scenes. Experiment with various techniques including painting on wet and dry paper, oil resist, pooling, and more.

We'll keep the earth healthy while creatingamazing recycled art! Imagine making your own artist's portfolio using only a paper grocery bag and some brads!
